Webinar Part 1: Managing Care for Older Adults with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (IDD), September 21, 9:30 – 11:30 a.m.

This course will provide participants with an overview of the common issues that emerge as individuals with intellectual disabilities age. We will review common health issues, changes in mental status, and behavior and functional changes that can affect consumers. A process for assessing and addressing age related issues among elders with IDD will be presented and case examples will be discussed to illustrate principles of care. Information will include:

- Age-related Changes in IDD
 - Medical changes
 - Cognitive changes
 - Functional changes
- Assessing the Needs of Aging Consumers
 - Comparison to baseline
 - Behavioral observations
 - Medical evaluation
 - Cognitive evaluation
- Case Examples

At the conclusion of the webinar, the participant will be able to:

- identify at least five common age related changes in older adults with intellectual disabilities,
- describe a comprehensive process for identifying the changing needs of clients with IDD, and
- describe at least three community resources available to addressing the needs of older adults with IDD.

Webinar Part 2: Behavior Management Principles for Older Adults with IDD and Dementia, October 19, 9:30 – 11:30 a.m.

This course will provide an overview of how to manage behavioral changes in consumers with IDD who also have dementia. We will review the key aspects of dementia and mental retardation that contribute to behavioral change and discuss the underlying principles of behavior management to address those changes. Emphasis will be placed on understanding how our approach to addressing behavior must change when dementia is part of the clinical picture for the individual with IDD. Information will include:

- Introduction to Dementia
 - Presentation of dementia in IDD
 - Cognitive changes associated with dementia
 - Interventions and treatment for dementia
- Altering our Approach to Care for Dementia
- Principles of Behavior Management
- Case Examples
- Questions and Answers

At the conclusion of the webinar, the participant will be able to:

- describe the most common signs of dementia in individuals with IDD,
- explain the difference between behavior management and behavior modification, and
- identify at least four underlying principles of behavior management.

Presenter: Kelly O'Shea Carney, PhD, CMC serves as the director of eldercare assessment and resources for Community Services Group (CSG). Dr. Carney is a licensed psychologist with a specialty in geriatrics and maintains national certification as a geriatric care manager. She has worked in a variety of health care and community settings providing behavioral health services to older adults and their caregivers. In her role at CSG, Dr. Carney provides leadership for the development and provision of the comprehensive mental health and geriatric care management services offered to older adults and their caregivers in the Lehigh Valley of Pennsylvania.

With particular expertise in the assessment and management of challenging behaviors associated with dementia, Dr. Carney has provided training to professional caregivers across the region on behavioral health and the elderly. With more than 20 years experience, she has been invited to speak on a variety of eldercare topics to many professional groups. Dr. Carney earned her bachelor's degree in psychology from St. Mary's College, Notre Dame, IN, and her master's and doctorate in counseling psychology with an emphasis in geropsychology from Southern Illinois University, Carbondale. She obtained her certification as a care manager from the National Academy of Certified Care Managers in Colchester, CN.
